## Simple Tips to Improve Your Pickleball Game

1. Always be in ready position and focused to be ready:
  - Feet shoulder width apart, knees slightly bent
  - Keep weight on the balls of your feet (not heels)
  - Relax shoulders and upper body
  - Keep paddle and arms up and in front of body with paddle slightly up
2. **Learn to dink—Dink early and dink often!**

Dinking is a soft short drop, primarily done near the non-volley zone (NVZ or kitchen) hit over the net into the opposing NVZ (kitchen).

Learning the soft game requires the ability to dink effectively.

Rules Tip: **Judging Line “In or Out” Balls – Rule of Thumb:**

- If you can see a gap between ball and line, the ball is called “out”. No gap or arc is over the line, the ball would be considered “in”.
- If a ball appears questionable or any doubt, the call would go to the advantage of the opponent and is considered “in”. If your team member disagrees, the ball is considered “in”.
- Calls should be made promptly (before opponent returns ball) and loudly. All players should be watching the ball as it is played.
