

## SCC PBC GENERAL MEETING- NOVEMBER 18, 2025

SCC PBC General meeting called to order at 6:05 pm, in the Florida room by John Orton-  
President

Board members are present-President, John Orton-VP, John Dresser-Treasurer, Don Chiapetta-Director-court usage, Eve Blazsur-Communications Director, Peter Cabral-Social Director, Mary Taylor-Secretary.

The membership was led by John Orton reciting the Pledge of Allegiance. A prayer was also given by Len Lewinski.

A quorum was verified President John Orton with 116 members in attendance and 28 proxies received at the meeting. We needed 20% of 495 members, which was 99 members.

Treasure-John Dresser reported Actual 2025 Budget of \$18,485.34 in checking, expenses are \$6401, there was over \$500 in income compared to last year. Other expenses were for pizza parties, lunch at the courts, ladies' nights, Friendsgiving, men's madness, just to name a few. Estimated Budget for 2026 total income \$17,567 and expenses of \$17,567.
